Chronic Cerebrospinal Venous Insufficiency (CCSVI) is a recently discovered medical condition linked to many neurological diseases and symptoms with previously unknown origins, including MS, Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, migraine, and IBS. Blood flow is restricted leading from the brain through narrowed veins and/or muscular or skeletal obstructions, leading to decreased oxygen levels in vital brain tissues.

The Saskatchewan government is currently funding a CCSVI clinical treatment trial in MS patients using venous angioplasty. The lead researcher for the Saskatchewan trial, Dr. Kenneth Mandato, is the keynote speaker at this Canadian CCSVI conference, joined by over 12 international and Canadian speakers. Federal MP Dr. Kirsty Duncan will address the status of CCSVI in Canada. Hear the latest research in brain oxygenation (perfusion), metals in the brain and metal sensitivity, blood flow, and diagnosis, treatment, and post-treatment care of CCSVI.
